Keynote Speaker MR. ANDREW RAMROOP

It is often said of the privileged 'some are born with a silver spoon' but for Andrew Madan Ramroop OBE, CMTT it could be described as 'with a tailors thimble in his fingers'.

So how could a young man born on squatting land on the forest of the northern range of Trinidad forest mountains; attended primary school until aged 13, from very under privileged parentage manage to navigate his way to become arguably the world's finest Savile Row Bespoke tailors.



What is not arguable is that he is the most decorated and accomplished. Andrew has won more awards and accolades than any other since the origin of the word 'tailor' back in the 13th century; to name just a few, the Mayor of London Trailblazer Award, Excellence Award, Chaconia Gold award, British Black Business Person of the year [2017].

He is also member of the National Advisory Board at the prestigious Harvard University's Du Bois Institute [African American Faculty]. Currently, Advisor to the World Federation of Master Tailors,

having been accepted by the prestigious Hillview College in Northern Trinidad, Andrew turned down the sought after college place in favour of pursuing a career in men's tailoring. His ethos is the pursuit of tailoring excellence, perfection to the highest standard attainable. Cutting and fitting suits in harmony with body shapes for style, elegance and comfort.

Although Andrew's expertise is now widely celebrated, his own journey to tailoring success is an unusual one. Coming alone to London from Trinidad aged 17 with a burning ambition to work amongst the finest tailors, he has exceeded his personal ambition to be named amongst the world's top 25 black designers.

As a graduate of the London College of Fashion, his skills became known by winning student competitions and completing the three year degree in just two years, gaining a Distinction.

After Fashion College, Andrew Ramroop started as understudy to Mr. Maurice Sedwell; fourteen years later he purchased the business. He is a true craftsman, the only practicing tailor on Savile Row to be awarded as an Officer of The Most Excellent Order of the British Empire (OBE) from Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, for services to tailoring and training. He also holds a Professorship for Distinction in the Field of Tailoring from the University of the Arts London.

Andrew's business acumen proved itself during the early 90s when many other shops on Savile Row were closing due to the recession, Andrew expanded Maurice Sedwell Ltd., into larger premises at their current location, 19 Savile Row. He took the business from less than 5% export to 75% export (2016). Maurice Sedwell now tailored suits for customers in 60 countries.

Named Ambassador for the British government Business is Great Britain campaign in 2015/16 and Black British Business Person of 2017. Andrew is passionate about training the next generation of elite tailors. In January 2008, he inaugurated the Savile Row Academy, where he now passes on his immense skills, knowledge and experience to others who are eager to have a meaningful career in tailoring.



MR. SHANNON WALTERS

WingFings Cuisine

From a tender age, "Wingfing", as he has affectionately been called by his uncle, has been intrigued by the goings-on in the kitchen on both sides of the family - particularly by his grandmothers, aunts and mother - and was ever present when a stove-top burner was lit. They nurtured his curiosity for years and often honoured him with the position of sous-chef.

Although he has enjoyed preparing a slew of local dishes for home, what piqued Shannon's interest was the novelty of the meals highlighted on the Food Network. So, as he began living on his own at the University of

the West Indies' Milner Hall, he was then able to experiment with international flavours to his heart's content.

His prominent kitchen presence led to him being assigned as one of the cooks for the Hall's Hawaiian-themed event, I-Block Luau in 2014, and as Head Chef and Menu Planner for the event in 2015.

It was during this time in university, he found a recipe for a dish called "pull-apart bread", and recreated it with several amendments. It was such a hit among friends who tried it that they pleaded with him to begin selling them, a suggestion Shannon finally heeded to in 2017. His business is now registered by the name of Wingfing's Cuisine: a service whose culinary point of view is to introduce non-traditional flavour combinations to the local population.

Some people plan on being entrepreneurs. They save money, quit their jobs and throw themselves into their passion. Others, like Shannon Walters, had a latent entrepreneurial spirit, which surfaced when he proved himself to be ready.

MR. ALEX NEDD

Waterholics

Alex Nedd is the owner of Tobago Waterholics, an Umbrella Watersports Company that provides a wide range of water activities from jet ski rentals to chartered boat tours and various watersports activities.

Mr. Nedd was exposed to the tourism industry at thirteen (13) years old when he started working for his brother's dive shop and became a certified divemaster. He officially registered the Waterholics brand in 2007.

He is passionate about the industry and has been active in marketing his brand and the Tobago tourism product. While Waterholics started off by marketing jet ski rentals only, it has now diversified into other tourism activities such as boat tours, waterfall tours, and other tourism sites as well as many other watersports activities.

Mr. Nedd is the recipient of the 2012 Division of Tourism Youth in Tourism Award and a Trinidad and Tobago National Award - 20 Stars of Tomorrow. He completed his tour operator certification from the Tobago Hospitality and Tourism Institute in 2008.

Founder and visionary Asha Mars-Lewis brings purpose and passion to the business of servicing the very individual needs that are found in the wedding industry.

Asha began honing her skills as a planner of small events in Brooklyn, New York, through Day Break World Ministries. A passion for weddings was quickly developed so she pursued training, later becoming a Certified Wedding Specialist.

Upon returning to Tobago in 2008 Asha identified a gap in the market for a fully dedicated wedding and event planning service. By 2009 her dream became a reality and Perfect Weddings and Events was birthed. Three years later she was awarded "The Excellence in Service Award" at the Tobago Business Awards.


